



## Munster Development Report – Lee Healy.

From the Irish Squash Funds we paid for additional hours in Limerick and supplied all coaches (except Limerick) with squash racquets and balls. We used the free-of-charge eye-guards that Irish Squash had in stock to supply each coach with 5 sets of eye-guards.

I am happy to report that in all 5 clubs the clubs supplied the lights free-of charge.

In all cases the juniors coached were not part of any existing coaching regime so they were all new to the game. Importantly from a Munster Squash perspective, junior coaching was either introduced or re-introduced in the case of three of the clubs.

Although in some cases the numbers are low, that is not unusual and it is a useful base from which to launch the next programme in September, finances permitting.

In the case of Dunhill, Limerick Lawn and Sunday's Well the clubs extended the coaching beyond those financed by us, another good sign!

Briany Dunbar and Peter Hayes were first time out coaches and both are 'old' level one coaches.

Plan is to integrate these players to become members of Irish Squash next season.
